4-YEAR PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES IN OREGON

All courses must have grades of C- or better

- 2 Second Language
- 3 Social Science
- 3 Science (2 labs recommended)
- 3 Math (Algebra I & above; senior year recommended)
- 4 English credits

PLUS

- High school graduation or equivalency
- Minimum 2.75 - 3.00 GPA
- SAT or ACT
- Additional coursework and other factors may increase likelihood of admission

SELECTIVE, PRIVATE 4-YEAR COLLEGES

- 3 - 4 Arts and/or Challenging Electives
- 3 - 4 Second Language
- 3 - 4 Social Science (including U.S. History)
- 3 - 4 Science (labs recommended)
- 3 - 4 Math (Algebra I & above; to pre-calculus or statistics)
- 4 English credits

PLUS

- High school graduation or equivalency
- Competitive GPA; mostly A's and B's
- Often requires SAT or ACT
- Honors, AP, IB, or college credit courses when available
- Extracurriculars or special achievements
